FCCLA Students Honored

York students earned gold, silver and bronze medals at the Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) State Leadership Conference, which took place in Springfield in April. York students won 19 gold medals and 21 silver medals at the event. Three York Students: Yusarah Haswarey, Kayla Tutunji and Elizabeth Greiwe earned "Most Outstanding" distinction, which was awarded to those with the top project in their category.
