BUILDING GOALS

• All students will grow by at least 30% on state standardized assessment from 8th grade to the end of junior year (using ACT counterparts to SAT scores).

• There will be an increase in students accessing college level experiences, career programs, internships, and / or courses at York that will prepare them for life beyond graduation.

PROFESSIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITIES

- Established roles / norms

INTERDISCIPLINARY OPPORTUNITIES

- WHO: Sophomore students
- WHAT: Examination of the convergence of social/cultural influences on individuals' and groups' liberties--and whether we're "okay" with those influences.
- WHEN: Spring 2017
- WHY: Asks students to synthesize and apply content from English 10, Social Studies, and Science to real and relevant issues, and to evaluate the implications of those issues.

- WHO: Freshman students
- WHAT: Examination of sexual abuse as a public health crisis.
- WHEN: Spring 2017
- WHY: Asks students to synthesize and apply content from English 10, Social Studies, and PE/Health to the public health crisis of sexual abuse, and to evaluate its relationship to personal and civic responsibilities.

CAREER PATHWAYS / CAREER DAY

• Emerging Pathways to support all students' interests: education, culinary, manufacturing, business (incubator).

• Career Day in April brought in business owners, community professionals, career experts to speak with students followed up by a career fair.

RTI (RESPONSE TO INTERVENTION)

• A committee was formed including student services staff, special education staff, department chairs, instructional coaches, and teachers to start explicitly hammering out a student support system.

• Tier 1, 2, and 3 level interventions were identified.

A referral process was created.
