Military Service Academies/ROTC/Intelligence Communities

There are five military academies:

Three reside within the Department of Defense:

The U.S. Military Academy at West Point, NY

The U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, MD

The U.S. Air Force Academy at Colorado Springs, CO

One resides within the Department of Transportation:

The U.S. Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point, NY

One resides within the Department of Homeland Security

The U.S. Coast Guard Academy at New London, CT

The admissions process to the US service academies is an extensive and very competitive process. All of these schools have an extremely competitive application process and are ranked annually by U.S. News & World Report and Forbes.com as some of the most selective colleges and universities in America. The average acceptance rate is between 8-17% for each of the schools. **Nominations**

are required for USMA, USNA, USAFA and USMMA.

ROTC: Army, Navy/ Marines, Air Force

ROTC scholarships are awarded in two different ways: Students can compete nationally for a scholarship during their senior year of high school or they can join ROTC once they get to college and compete for a scholarship at the campus level. At the national level, about 12,000 high school seniors compete for about 2,000 Army ROTC scholarships. About half of those are three-year scholarships, and the other half are four-year scholarships. Getting a scholarship does NOT automatically bind you to service.

THE ILLINOIS TUITION WAIVER

Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) Scholarships (105 ILCS 5/30-16): TUITION COVERED

- ▶ Eligibility and Criteria: Illinois Residents enrolled in ROTC programs available at universities supported by the State of Illinois are eligible. Scholarships are awarded on a merit basis to those eligible recipients receiving the highest grades with evidence of leadership ability. Waivers shall be awarded at each university on the basis of the equivalent of 10 scholarships per class, per branch of service, each academic year.
- ► There is **no military commitment** until the beginning of your Junior academic year (unless you are contracted)
- You acquire it by: being an Illinois resident, registering for the Military Science courses, have a minimum of 2.5 cumulative GPA to be awarded (3.0 cumulative High School GPA for incoming Freshmen), and maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA and a 3.0 ROTC cumulative GPA to retain. ALL Scholarships are contingent upon an applicant being medically qualified, physically fit, and in attendance for all ROTC functions.
